Thomas ap. C. Jones exchanges with Elias L. Carter, Negro Polly and Child Malvina with the difference in price hereby acknowledged to be received by E. L. Carter for Felicia and her children Lemis and Sarah, then John H. Carter exchanges with Thomas ap. C. Jones negro Diana and her Children Charles and Catharine and little Pippin at their Valuation, for the aforesaid Felicia and her Children Lemis and Sarah; The parties hereby mutually and reciprocally binding themselves to defend each other from all and every person or persons, claiming of or under them in any manner, mode or form whatsoever, as witnesses our hands and seals this sixteenth day of January in the year of our Lord eighteen hundred and Twenty nine
